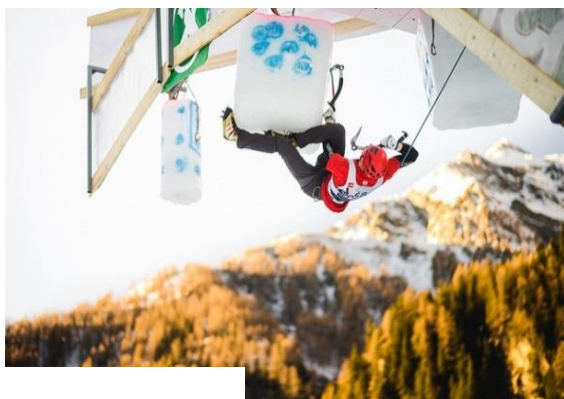

3. HOW TO FOLLOW & PROMOTE ICE CLIMBING

The UIAA's commitment to ice climbing is total and designed to ensure coverage of the sport is year round. Communication naturally intensifies during the season itself, with the conversation continuing throughout the year – for athletes, coaches, federations, media, partners and fans alike. This section provides details on how to follow the 2019 UIAA Ice Climbing season.

3.1 UIAA COMMUNICATION TO ATHLETES

The most important information is communicated to athletes and federation by email in two ways.

2. Specific news releases sent by the UIAA to a dedicated ice climbing mailing list.

All athletes registered for the 2019 UIAA Ice Climbing season have been added to the ice climbing mailing list using the email provided when applying for last season's competition licence. 3.3 LIVESTREAMING AND VIDEO COVERAGE

For the 2019 season, the UIAA will be working with QTV as they did in 2017 as a distribution and production partner to ensure the sport is again covered in an innovative, comprehensive and professional manner with great live and non-live content. We also have media partners in the Extreme Channel, Olympic Channel and EpicTV.

Livestreaming will be available from the semi-finals and finals of competitions at all events and available immediately as a play-back. Furthermore, highlights of key competition moments such as medal climbs, decisive duels and spectacular moments will be cut as clips and shared on the UIAA social media channels. Additionally, collated highlight packages and short features were also available and both formed part of the livestream itself. Livestream presentation and commentary comes from Liam Lonsdale. The livestream will be fed into the UIAA Facebook, Twitter and YouTube channels and also embedded on the UIAA website.

The feed from some events was also shared on partner channels such as the Extreme Channel, IOC's Olympic Channel and EpicTV. The 2018 season was a huge success, reaching over 12 million people comprising three million unique video views and 1.6 million views of the livestreams. For the coming season, the Olympic Channel and the UIAA will reinforce this partnership with full season being broadcast on the channel to help attract a new ice climbing audience.

The UIAA is working on a new results system with live digital updates and mobile friendly service for the upcoming season which will be updated instantly after each competitor – further details of this will follow.

3.6 INTERVIEW REQUESTS

You the athletes are the heart of ice climbing. Your commitment, dedication, passion, skill and the camaraderie of the ice climbing community is what makes the sport so compelling especially as we move forwards with our bid for Olympic inclusion. The UIAA wishes to share your unique stories and backgrounds and both during the season and the off season greatly appreciates your support in producing content about ice climbing and you the ice climbers.

3.7 THE 'ICE BOX'

At all the 2019 World Ice climbing event finals we will have a new 'Ice Box' – which is where the current leader will sit after he/she has competed in the finals. So if you are out first in the final you will automatically be the leader, so you will go and sit on the seat in the designated area, and if the next competitor surpasses your high point you will need to vacate the seat and they will take your place, if not you stay there.

Sometimes there will be space for the other finalists to hang out with the current leader and discuss the final climbs etc. but this will depend on the venue and the space available. Obviously our event venues are outside and you maybe sat there for almost an hour so make sure you have some warm clothing with you – if you have left your gear in isolation or somewhere else please let one of the officials know and they will get your gear for you – please don't leave the 'Ice Box' until the final is over.

3.8 CURRENT WORLD CUP LEADER & WORLD CHAMPIONS

At all the 2019 World events we will have new special bibs available for the current World Cup Leaders and the current World Champions to wear. The current World Cup Leader bib will be a different colour to the usual bibs and will pass from one competitor to the next if the lead changes during the season. The World Champion bibs can be worn by their holders for the entirety of their reign as World Champion. These will be distributed at the first event of the season.

3.9 MEDAL CEREMONY & PODIUMS

New for 2019 – in order for us to conform to the IOC medal ceremony protocol and make the medal ceremonies more succinct and flow better only the top 3 athletes will be invited to podium in each discipline. All finalists will still receive prize money which can be collected from the organisers after the medal ceremony has finished. The UIAA event coordinator will give you a short briefing at each event as to the procedure to follow for medal ceremony, so please ensure you follow this procedure.

The UIAA ICC would also like the podium athletes to wear their competition bibs on the podium, however we understand that if the weather is cold or snowy then it maybe more practical to wear insulating clothing on the podium, but if possible the competition bib should be visible.

4. REGISTRATION

4.1 APPLY FOR AN INTERNATIONAL ICE CLIMBING COMPETITION LICENCE

In order to apply for an International Ice Climbing Competition Licence, each athlete must contact the UIAA Member Federation he/she is affiliated to. It is the ice climbing focal point within the given UIAA Member Federation who files the official application for an international competition licence. A licence costs EUR 50 per season and athlete and must be paid either through the UIAA Member Federation or directly by the athlete to the UIAA, prior to the first competition.

Each athlete must show his/her valid International Ice Climbing Competition Licence during

on-site registrations of a UIAA competition. A licence is only valid if signed and stamped by the affiliated UIAA Member Federation, signed by the competitor and his/her legal guardian in case of under age (not 18 years old).

Each UIAA Member Federation is given a login to the website and here it can file applications for all its athletes for the upcoming season: <http://results.theuiaa.org/admin>

The application period starts on 1 November and ends one week before the last competition of the respective season. Late registrations may be accepted, depending on the local organizer and may result in higher registration fees.

4.2 REGISTER FOR EVENTS

Registration to UIAA competitions also goes through the UIAA Member Federations, reason being quotas. Thus, each athlete wishing to compete in the UIAA Ice Climbing World Tour must contact the UIAA Member Federation he/she is affiliated to and indicate which competitions and categories he/she wishes to compete in. The website for UIAA Member Federations to proceed with the registration of athletes is the same as for the licences.

At registration at the actual event, each competitor must either pay their license fee or prove that their national federation has paid the license fee in advance. The Competitor Registration Fee for each World Cup or World Championships is EUR 50 / competitor and shall be paid to each Organizer directly by the competitors prior to the competition. The fee allows participation in all types of competitions of that specific event.

Note: The local organizer of the UIAA Ice Climbing World Cup in Cheongsong, South Korea wishes to know your exact arrival and departure details as well as special requests for accommodation. 6.2 REGULATION CHANGES AT A GLANCE

Summary of major modifications* made to the 2019 Competition Regulations for International Ice Climbing Competitions as agreed by the UIAA Ice Climbing Commission

*Minor modifications to format, grammar and wording have not been listed below. Please also note the reorganisation of the rules into more user friendly format which has altered the numbering sequence from previous years.

PART 1 – GOVERNANCE	
2.2.3	It is the responsibility of all team officials and competitors to ensure that they are fully informed of all details relating to a competition.
2.3	ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER A TEAM New section – see rules document
2.4	REGISTRATION OF TEAMS New section – see rules document
2.5	INTERNATIONAL LICENSES New section – see rules document
2.6	FEES New section – see rules document
2.8.3(a)	gloves (must not be fingerless)
3.5.3	It is mandatory for all people in the field of play to wear helmets including during the route observation period.
3.9	TECHNICAL MEETING New section – see rules document
3.16.3	No pets or children are to be involved in the Award Ceremony
4.1.1	Red zone boundaries and the areas beyond them cannot be used for climbing.
4.3.2 (f)	No children or pets in the isolation zone.
4.4	ROUTE DEMONSTRATION New section – see rules document
4.6.5	Athletes have a 40 seconds time limit from the time facing the climbing wall to start climbing. All preparation including tying into the climbing rope shall be done beforehand. At the end of this 40 second time period, the climbing time will be started irrespective of the athlete's position.
5.2.5 a)	At the earliest convenient time after issuing a 'Yellow' or 'Red Card', the President of the Jury shall: Submit a written statement on the UIAA Disciplinary Action Form to the competitor's team manager (or in the absence of a team manager, to the competitor concerned) regarding the offence and whether the President of the Jury proposes to refer the matter for consideration in respect to further

	disciplinary action in accordance with the regulations.
5.2.5 b)	The President of the Jury shall submit a copy of this written statement on the UIAA Disciplinary Action Form detailing the offence against the regulations, any evidence, and any recommendations regarding consideration of additional sanction to the UIAA COMMISSION for referral to the UIAA disciplinary body.
6.1.1	An appeal shall only be accepted if accompanied by the official appeal fee and the UIAA Official Appeal Form .
PART 2 – TECHNICAL RULES	
8.1.2	In exceptional circumstances, the Jury President may decide to cancel a round of the competition, in which case the results of the remaining rounds shall determine the ranking of competitors for the competition.
8.2.	NUMBER OF COMPETITORS AND THE STARTING ORDER Multiple changes – see document
8.4.2	Each competitor's attempt shall be deemed to have started when every part of the competitor's body has left the ground and one ice-axe has left the starting point.
8.4.3	If it is required for athletes to start the route in a way that every part of the competitor's body shall leave the ground, the starting position shall have a clearly marked red line.
8.5.2	e) If a competitor let's go the lower axe just before falling, the score of upper axe shall count. f) Priority for ranking competitors in case of tied competitors who all topped the route in lead: a. Qualification: i. Attempts - competitors reaching a certain height at first attempt are placed better than the ones reaching the same height at second attempt. ii. Time – if the qualification round included isolation b. Semi-final, final or super final: i. Time
8.6.3	If isolation was used for the given round of the competition and if two or more athletes reach top in any round, the climber's time of that round is decisive for his/her ranking: the faster competitor is being ranked ahead of the slower. If there is no isolation for that round, the climbers will remain tied.
9.1.4	A practice period before the qualification process begins is mandatory and should allow for at least one climb per competitor. The practice maybe conducted on the competition routes or on routes of similar quality and difficulty – this will be the decision of the President of the Jury. The President of the Jury shall announce the timing and duration of any practice period at the technical meeting.
9.1.5	During the final stages of the competition, each round of the competition should follow on immediately from the last, with men and women alternating i.e. when the men have completed one round, the women will start their next round and the men will rest and so on. In the single route format each category will complete all their attempts on the route before moving onto the next category.
9.1.6	In exceptional circumstances, the Jury President may decide to cancel a round of the competition, in which case the results of the remaining rounds shall determine the ranking of competitors for the competition.

9.4.1 c)	Both hand timing and mechanical-electrical timing system shall be used at the same time. Because, if the mechanical-electrical system fails, there is no need to rerun the competition and the times recorded by hand timing shall be used for the entire round and the mechanical-electrical results will be discounted i.e. a mix of times is not allowed.
9.6.3 i.	On being called to the start of a route by the Category Judge, each competitor shall take up a starting position consisting of minimum one foot on the floor and at least one foot and one hand shall be on the ice.
9.7.1	Speed competitions shall consist of two rounds – although if the qualification round produces more than 16 climbers with valid times a semi-final round maybe required.
9.7.2	Speed-duel competitions shall always consist of two routes that shall be of the same length and of similar profile and difficulty. After climbing their first route competitors shall switch route as soon as possible, competitors are not allowed to walk a longer way to reach the second route in order to have more time for recovering. If this occurs the athlete may incur a disciplinary sanction.
9.7.3 v.	Final and Semi Final Round - number of competitors: a) When the number of competitors recording a valid time on both routes during the Qualification Round is 16 or more, then 16 competitors shall qualify for the Semi Final Round and 8 for the Final Round; b) When the number of competitors recording a valid time on both routes during the Qualification Round is less than 16, then 8 competitors shall qualify for the Final Round.
9.7.5 i.	On being called to the start of a route by the Category Judge, each competitor shall take up a starting position consisting of minimum one foot on the floor and at least one foot and one hand shall be on the ice.
10.1.4	In exceptional circumstances, the Jury President may decide to cancel a round of the competition, in which case the results of the remaining rounds shall determine the ranking of competitors for the competition.
PART 3 – EVENT RULES	
11.7.1	a) National team quota - Host country: 8 women, 8 men
12.1.1	In accordance with the Statutes of the UIAA COMMISSION, a World Difficulty & Speed Championship competition could be organized every other year, alternating with the World Combined Championships.
12.2.1	b) National team quota - Host country: 8 women, 8 men
13.	WORLD COMBINED CHAMPIONSHIPS REGULATIONS New section – see rules document
14.1.6	At the decision of the President of the Jury certain age categories of the Lead competition routes maybe climbed on top rope.
14.1.7	In case of Top-Rope route in Lead qualification, regardless of height of climber in first attempt, they are allowed to have second attempt.
16.	CONTINENTAL CUP SERIES REGULATIONS New section – see rules document

6.3 ANTI-DOPING/CLEAN CLIMBING

The UIAA promotes Clean Climbing by adopting and implementing the World Anti-Doping (WADA) Programme in its entirety. In parallel, the UIAA is responsible for ensuring that all of

its member associations and athletes respect and comply with all relevant International Standards and all the principles inherent to the World Anti-Doping Code, including the registered testing pool and the doping violation procedure. As part of the registration process for the annual UIAA Ice Climbing World Tour, all athletes are required to complete a mandatory anti-doping questionnaire and educational programme.
